

The stay of the suspension against your driving privilege has been ended. The suspension resulting from the arrest on July 03, 2017, is hereby set aside.

is hereinafter also known as "Respondent."

The following findings and determinations are the results of your hearing on March 21, 2018.

Probable Cause:

On or about Monday, July 03, 2017 at 1:34 AM, Officer Reynaga, Badge # 21395, of the Newhall CHP, contacted Respondent as a result of a traffic collision and, upon investigation, had determined that Respondent was a suspect driver involved in the collision and that Respondent had fled the scene of the collision in violation of California law.

The determination of driving was based on: Respondent's admission of driving to Officer

The time of the collision is determined to have been 1:05 AM, based on:

o An admission by respondent to arresting officer.

The evidentiary basis for the finding on the probable cause issue is:

- Our Unsatisfactory Field Sobriety Tests.
- An admission of alcohol consumption.

The evidentiary basis for the finding on the objective symptoms of intoxication issue is:

- o The DS-367 (Officer's Sworn Statement).
- ° The Arrest Report.
- o The Supplemental Report.



° The Accident Report.

° The testimony at the hearing by Officer Reynaga that Respondent admitted at the scene to having consumed an alcoholic beverage.

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Reasonable Cause:

Based on the preceding findings concerning probable cause, Officer's determination of driving, the Officer's belief that Respondent was intoxicated because of the objective symptom of intoxication, and the additional reported factors that the Officer used to form the belief of intoxication, it is hereby determined that Officer had reasonable cause to believe that Respondent was driving a motor vehicle while under the influence of alcohol.

IV

Lawful Arrest:

On 7/3/2017, at 2:15 AM Respondent was arrested for violation of Vehicle Code Section 23152, 23153, or 23140.

The determination that Respondent was arrested under the charge of driving under the influence, Vehicle Code Section 23152, 23153, or 23140 is based on:

° Explicit statements in DMV's documentary evidence.

° The testimony of Officer Reynaga at the hearing that Respondent was verbally informed of the charge at the time of the arrest.

The authority to arrest Respondent was granted to Officer under Section 40300.5 of the California Vehicle Code.

As a result of the reasonable cause determination and the subsequent findings of an arrest taking place, it is hereby determined that Respondent was lawfully arrested for a violation of Vehicle Code Section 23152, 23153, or 23140.

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Chemical Test:

As based on the evidence presented for this matter, it is hereby determined that Respondent submitted to and completed a chemical test of his blood, with a result of 0.08 % B.A.C. at 03:23 AM on 7/3/17.

Counsel for Respondent contends the chemical test result does not reflect the true blood alcohol content (BAC) at the time of driving because high readings with the BAC Blood testing equipment used and this is supported based on the following: Testimony of Expert D. Beckner that according to Exhibit #4 LASD Blood Test Final Run Report the Quality Control Sample Target are reading higher by .001% -.003%. Although the target sample test are within acceptable range according to Title17 the variance of the quality test samples reading has significant impact on respondent's test results which would put his BAC below .08%. Relying upon the information contained in the printout, the driver's expert witness a forensic toxicologist opined that his actual BAC level could have been .079-.077% not meeting the legal threshold of .08%

In this case although high readings are within the permissible variance the fact that respondent's BAC- Blood .080% it is reasonable to believe this high readings could impact his true test results below .08% Counsel further supported the expert's opinion by citing Brenner Case Law.

There is no other evidence for the department to rely upon in efforts of proving respondent's BAC was greater than .08% at the time of driving. No PAS test samples obtained according to the arresting officer.

As a result of the preceding finding the administrative action against Respondent's driving privilege cannot be upheld in this case.

VI

Driving With B.A.C. At Or Above 0.08%:

Based on the preceding it is determined that the preponderance of evidence in this case supports that Respondent was not driving a motor vehicle at the time that the concentration of alcohol in his blood was at or above 0.08%.

DETERMINATION OF ISSUES

- 1) The peace officer had reasonable cause to believe you were driving a motor vehicle in violation of Vehicle Code Section 23140, 23152, or 23153.
- 2) You were placed under lawful arrest.

3) You were not driving a motor vehicle when you had .08% or more by weight of alcohol in your blood.

DECISION

As a result of the preceding Findings & Determination, suspension of your driving privilege is hereby set aside as specified here in these documents.







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Chemical Test:

As based on the evidence presented for this matter, it is hereby determined that Respondent submitted to and completed a chemical test of his breath, with results of 0.08 % B.A.C. at 12:43 AM on 7/22/18 and 0.08 % B.A.C. at 12:46 AM on 7/22/18.

The claim that the chemical test result does not reflect the true blood alcohol content (BAC) at the time of driving because of a rising BAC is supported based on the following: Counsel's contention that Respondent's BAC was under 0.08% when driving is given merit; based on Respondent's Expert Dewayne Beckner, and the Department's exhibits. Expert's testimony as to time PAS tests being 0.086% and 0.104% BAC an hour and thirty five minutes from time of event, and breath tests being 0.08% and 0.08% over two hours and 38 minutes from time of accident. Expert Beckner's testimony revealed that Respondent's BAC more likely was at 0.05% at either time of driving, and thereby below a 0.08% BAC while either Respondent was operating a motor vehicle or at time of the collision. As a result of the preceding finding the administrative action against Respondent's driving privilege cannot be upheld in this case.

VI

Other Findings:

° Dewayne Beckner's testimony is deemed credible in that the information testified to be his own area of expertise, therefore his opinion can be relied up on to support the contentions presented in this case and rebuts the Department's evidence. As a result the administrative action in this case cannot be upheld.

VII

Driving With B.A.C. At Or Above 0.08%:

Based on the preceding it is determined that the preponderance of evidence in this case supports that Respondent was not driving a motor vehicle at the time that the concentration of alcohol in his blood was at or above 0.08%.


